	Short Table Runner Approximate finished size 52 x 24 inches	Long Table Runner Approximate finished size 82 x 24 inches
LIGHT FABRIC Blocks, Background, Sashing, Setting Triangles	1 yard	1-1/2 yards
LEAF FABRIC Dark / print	1/2 yard or Fat Quarters	3/4 yard or Fat Quarters
Border Fabric Dark / print	1/3 yard	1/2 yard
Binding	1/2 yard	1/2 yard
Backing -	1-3/4 yards	2-3/4 yards
Batting	1 yard x 90 inches	1 yard x 90 inches

PLACE MAT SUPPLY LIST	
<p>Six Placemats Approximate finished size 20 x 14 inches each</p>	
LIGHT FABRIC Background	1 yard
LEAF FABRIC	<p>1/3 yard - one color of leaves Note—this is a generous measurement. You can use a combination of Fat Quarters, Fat Eights or scraps. Use as many fabrics as you would like.</p>
BORDER FABRIC	3/4 yard
BACKING FABRIC	<p>3 yards - 40 inch wide Or 1-1/2 yard - 108 inch wide (selvedges pinned to leaders) Or 1-1/2 yards Main Backing Fabric PLUS 10 - 12 inches x 1-1/2 yards for the extra width. See note below and illustration on the next page.</p>
BINDING	1 yard
Batting	Crib Size
<p>Backing Fabric Notes - The pieced place mats are 40 inches wide before quilting. You will need to add an extra piece of fabric to the backing fabric to make it wide enough.</p> <p>If you are making the Table Runner, I would quilt that first and use the extra Table Runner backing fabric to add the width to the backing. See the next page for an explanation and illustration on this.</p>	
<p>Note: The piecing instructions for this project are written using the Stitch and Flip method. If you would prefer use special piecing rulers to make the Half Square Triangles, I recommend the Easy Angle ruler by EZ Quilting. See previous page for details on this ruler.</p> <p>This template should be available from your local quilt shop or online.</p>	

Autumn Leaves Table Runners and Placemats

Items you will need for the quilting -

Thread - Use whatever thread works in your quilting machine and we will be using a few different threads for this project. Here are some suggestions for thread.

Variegated Thread - can be used in any part of this design. I especially love using the variegated thread on the leaves! There are many "Fall color" variegated threads available from a variety of manufacturers. Find what thread works best in your machine and have fun using them!!

For the Optional Border Thread Painting Embellishment

We will be using marking pens to draw around specific sized templates, which we will be making.

I prefer the **Fine Point Crayola Washable Markers**. Note - to remove the marker, the quilt **MUST** be washed in warm water, with detergent, in a washing machine.

We are going to be making templates which we will be drawing around and using as quilting guides. These templates work best if they are made from **PIECING plastic** template material. This material can be found in most quilting and chain fabric stores.

IMPORTANT - I have found that **HEAVY DUTY** template plastic works best. I recommend Dritz Heavy Duty Template Plastic which comes in a 12 x 18 inch sheet. The templates we need can be cut from **1 sheet** of this plastic.

If you can't find this type of template plastic, that's ok. You can use any firm-ish, translucent plastic. Your templates may be a bit "floppy" but they will work!

One other thing you may want to use for the Optional Border Thread Painting Embellishment

My preferred method of marking for the thread painting is using markers (see above) but, if your borders are a dark-ish fabric, and you have problems seeing your markings, here is an alternative.

I will use **Solvay**, which is a water soluble stabilizer and made by Sulky. You should find this at most quilt shops or online.
